Historical Note:

The Children of the Confederacy is an auxiliary organization of the United Daughters of the Confederacy (UDC). The Dixie Gray Chapter was sponsored by the Roanoke Chapter of the UDC. Membership was open to persons under eighteen who were descendants of men or women who served the Confederate States of America. The Dixie Gray chapter was founded in the fall of 1949 with 8 members; by spring of 1950 it had 18 members. The goals of the organization were: honoring the men and women of the Confederacy; learning about the history of the Civil War; and serving society through civic affairs, benevolence, and patriotism.

Scope and Content:

The collection consists of four scrapbooks, covering club activities from 1949-1955, and additional loose documents. The scrapbooks were compiled by Dixie Gray members and document the history of the Civil War and the activities of the club through newspaper and magazine clippings, as well as historic site ephemera. The additional documents include handwritten letters from two Civil War soldiers, George M. Hanson and Julius B. Buford, written during the war; the Sept. 6, 1865, issue of the *Daily Republican* newspaper, Lynchburg, Virginia; and a photograph of a portrait of Robert E. Lee.
