AMERICAN HISTORY gives a heritage of the past as it proceeds through the years and is reflected in the present . . . within this framework consideration of the commonwealth





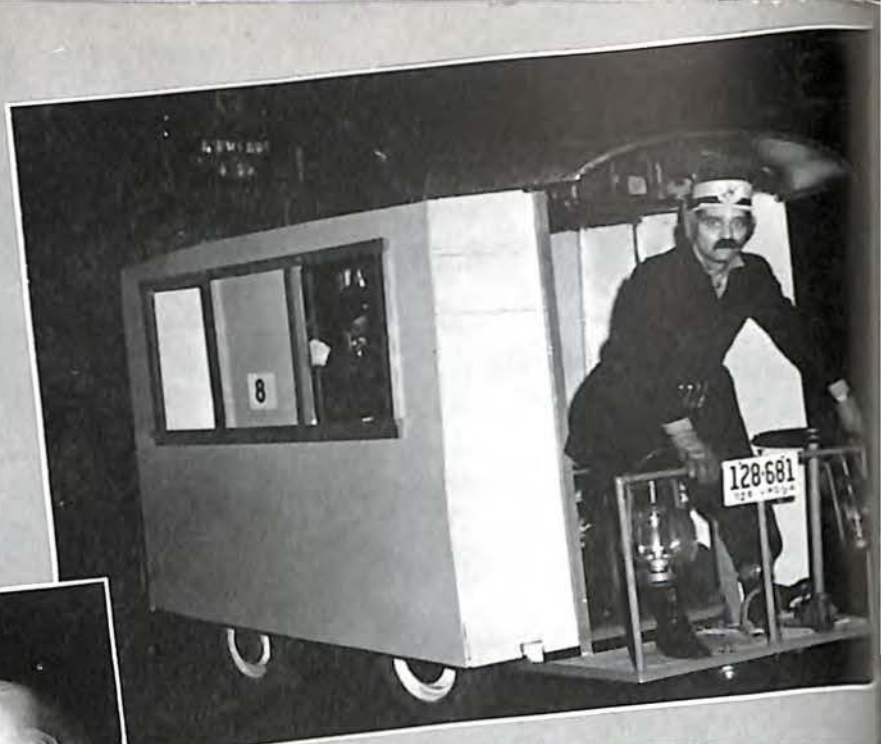

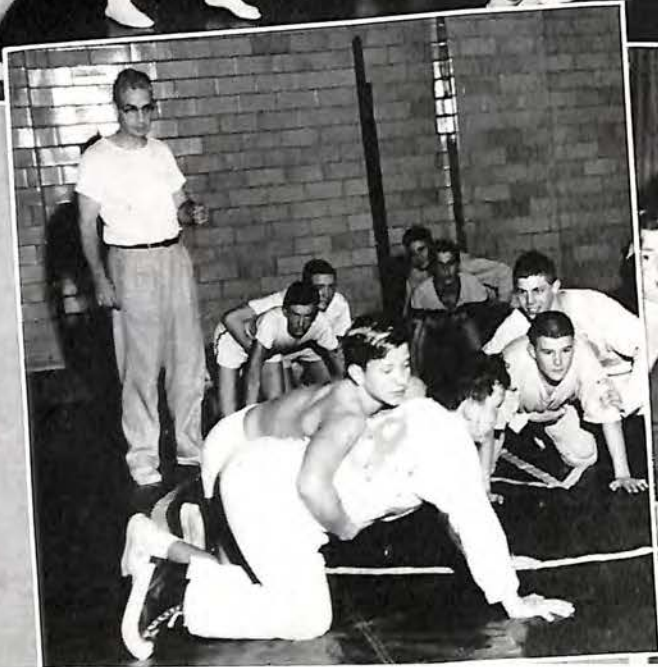

BUSINESS . . . Students are trained to go into business directly from high school or to prepare for further business training in college . . . for careers in stenography . . . bookkeeping . . . and clerical work . . . More

and more academic students are now taking typing as they realize its value . . . Students gain experience and knowledge through constant practice . . . skills and accuracy are developed as the class progresses . . . Knowledge of our work increases day by day . . . W. Myers is working on his posting assignment.

MUSIC . . . Learning to appreciate music of different types . . . Jazz . . . Classical . . . Popular . . . Giving us pleasure and relaxation . . . Developing our abilities by practicing and increasing our knowledge of music and creating enjoyment for others . . . Many opportunities arise in which our talent may be put to use . . . FOREIGN LANGUAGES . . . offer wonderful opportunities for increasing our knowledge of other countries. We have a choice of either French, Spanish or Latin. Latin is the basis for all languages and an essential in translation of modern romance languages. Jefferson is one of the few schools which offer four years of Latin.

The study of **English** gives each student a better appreciation of the world's literature as well as knowledge of grammar usage and speech. 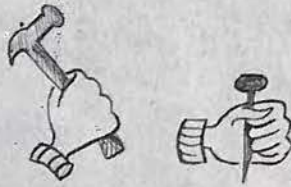

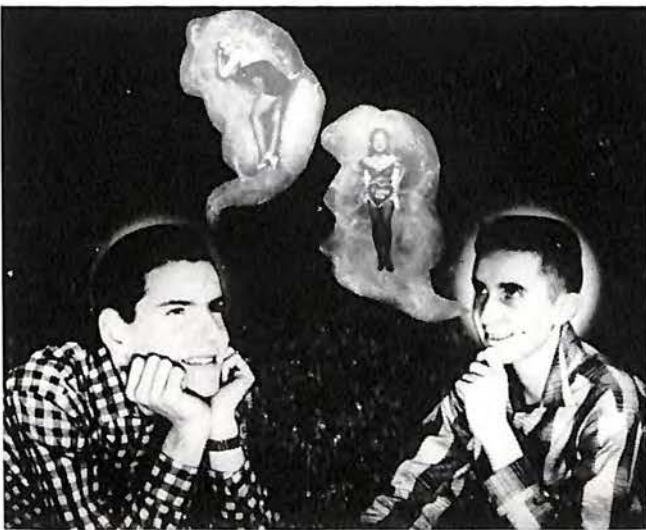

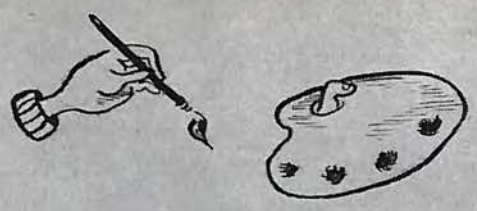

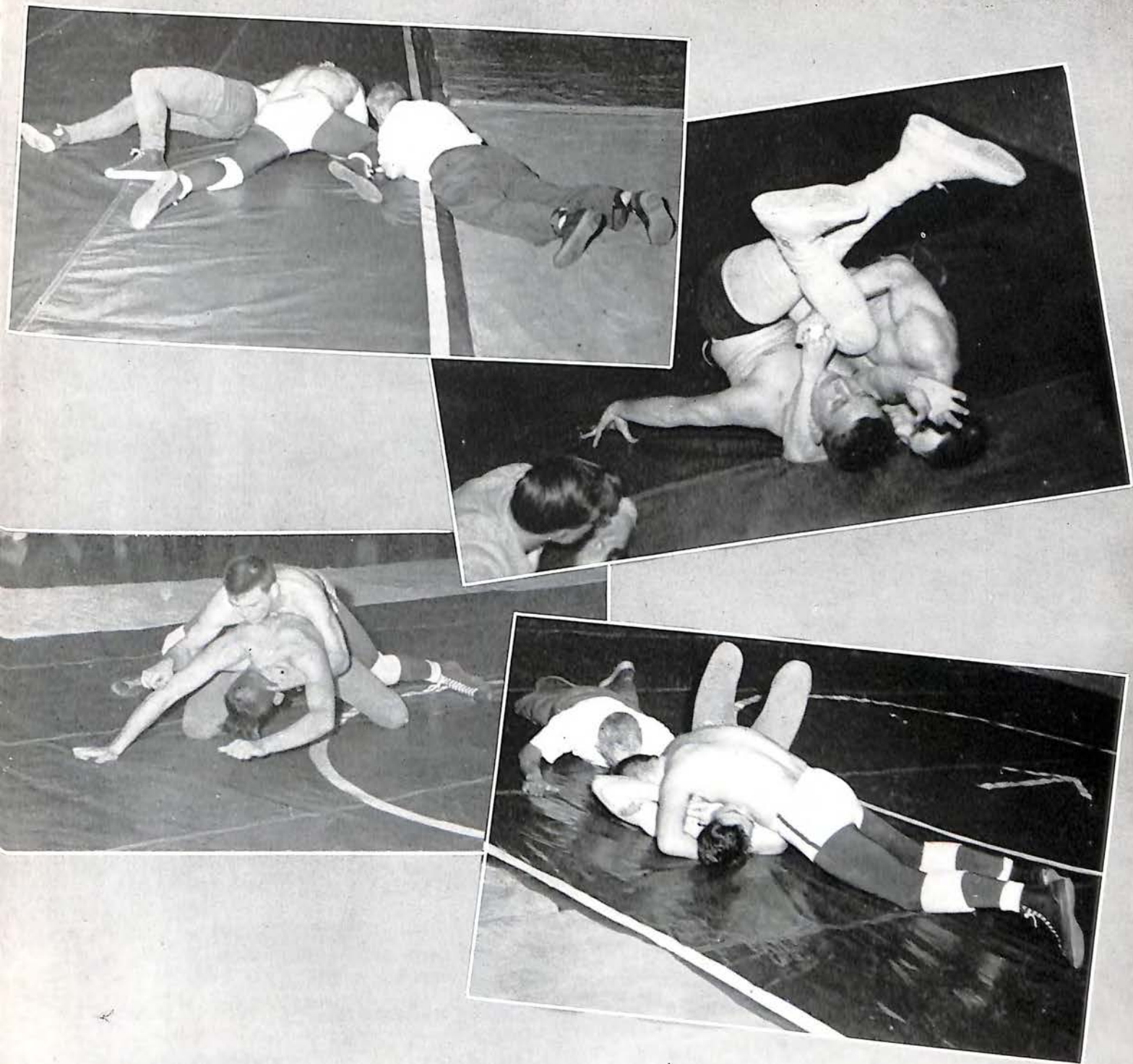

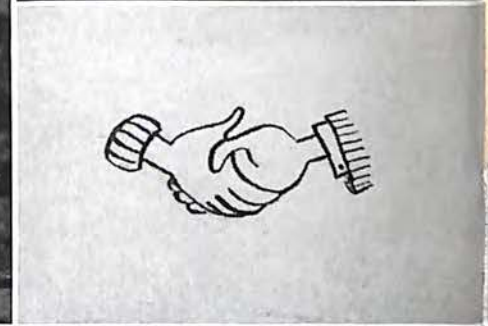

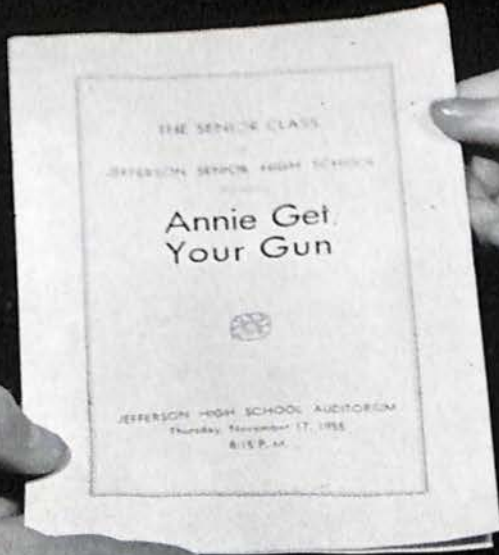
