Biographical Note:

Mignon Chubb-Hale was born Virginia Mignon Chubb in Roanoke, Virginia on 3 November 1942 and was the third child of Perneller Delaney Chubb and Leon Chubb. She has one sister, Perneller Chubb-Wilson and one brother, Richard Lee Chubb. She also has one son, Brian Chubb-Hale.

After graduating from Lucy Addison High School in 1961, Chubb-Hale received her Bachelors of Science in Elementary Education from Bluefield State College in 1966. She completed her Masters of Education from the University of Virginia in 1972.

Chubb-Hale retired from Roanoke City School in 1997 after 23 years working as an educator, having taught at Wasena Elementary, Lincoln Terrace Elementary and Addison Middle schools.

In addition to teaching Chubb-Hale has been active with many professional, civic and political organizations, including serving on the boards of Roanoke City Schools, Roanoke Catholic Schools, the Harrison Museum of African American Culture, the Roanoke Valley Reservation Foundation, the American Association of University Women, the Roanoke Chapter of the NAACP, and the SCLC. She has also received numerous accolades, including the NAACP Outstanding Educator

Award, The Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Award for Peace, Justice and Equality, the National Conference of Christians and Jews Award for Exemplary Life and Contribution to Brotherhood of the Community, the 2009 YWCA Woman of Achievement Award in Racial Harmony and the Saint Katharine Drexel Award.

Scope and Content:

- The Mignon Chubb-Hale Collection is comprised of one (1) record storage box.
- The collection is comprised of color photographs, correspondences, booklets, published works, class programs and other class documents, newspaper clippings, and City of Roanoke Proclamations.
- A majority of the collection is centered around Mignon Chubb-Hale's Lincoln Terrace
 Elementary School Sixth Grade Classes from the 1984 1985 and 1986 1987 school years,
 however documents from the 1982 1983 school year are included as well as a booklet
 written by Mignon Chubb-Hale regarding teaching techniques and two City of Roanoke
 Proclamations, referencing her life and activities.
